Kindergarten – content is listed by strand.

First Grade – content is listed by strand. Content with which students possess some prior knowledge from <u>kindergarten</u> is highlighted in <u>red</u>.

Second Grade – content is listed by strand. Content with which students possess some prior knowledge from <u>kindergarten</u> is highlighted in <u>red</u>. Content with which students possess some prior knowledge from <u>first grade</u> is highlighted in green. Content having connections to <u>kindergarten</u> and <u>first grade</u> is highlighted in purple.

Third Grade – content is listed by strand. Content with which students possess some prior knowledge from <u>first grade</u> is highlighted in green. Content with which students possess some prior knowledge from <u>second grade</u> is highlighted in <u>blue</u>. Content with which students possess some prior knowledge from <u>first and second grade</u> is highlighted in <u>orange</u>. Content having connections to <u>kindergarten and first grade</u> is highlighted in <u>yellow</u>. Content having connections to <u>kindergarten and grade two</u> is highlighted in <u>purple</u>. Content having connections to <u>kindergarten</u>, <u>grade one</u>, and <u>grade</u> two is highlighted in <u>red</u>.
