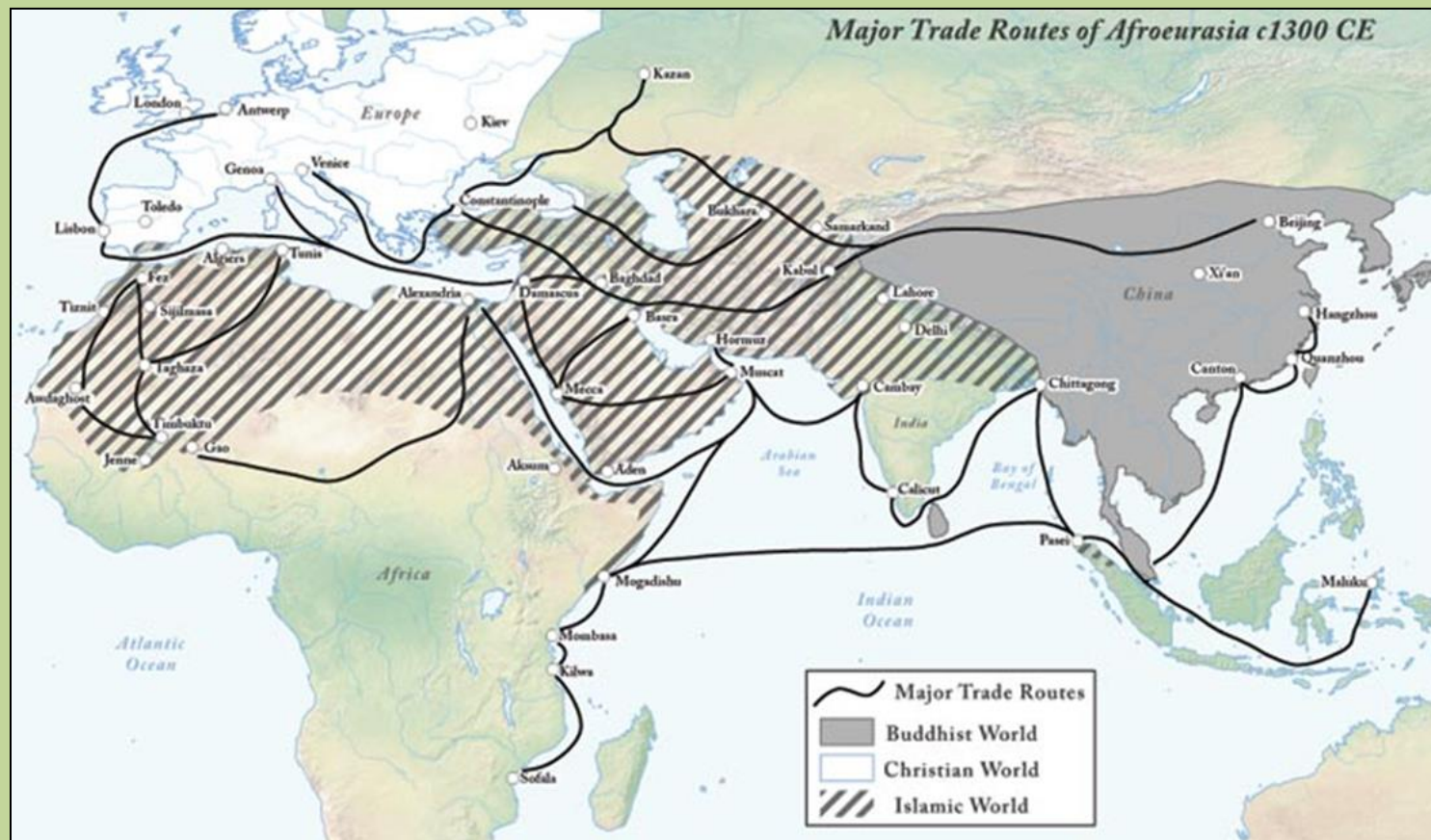


Spread of Religions

- By 1500 A.D. (C.E.), the five world religions had spread to many areas of the Eastern Hemisphere.

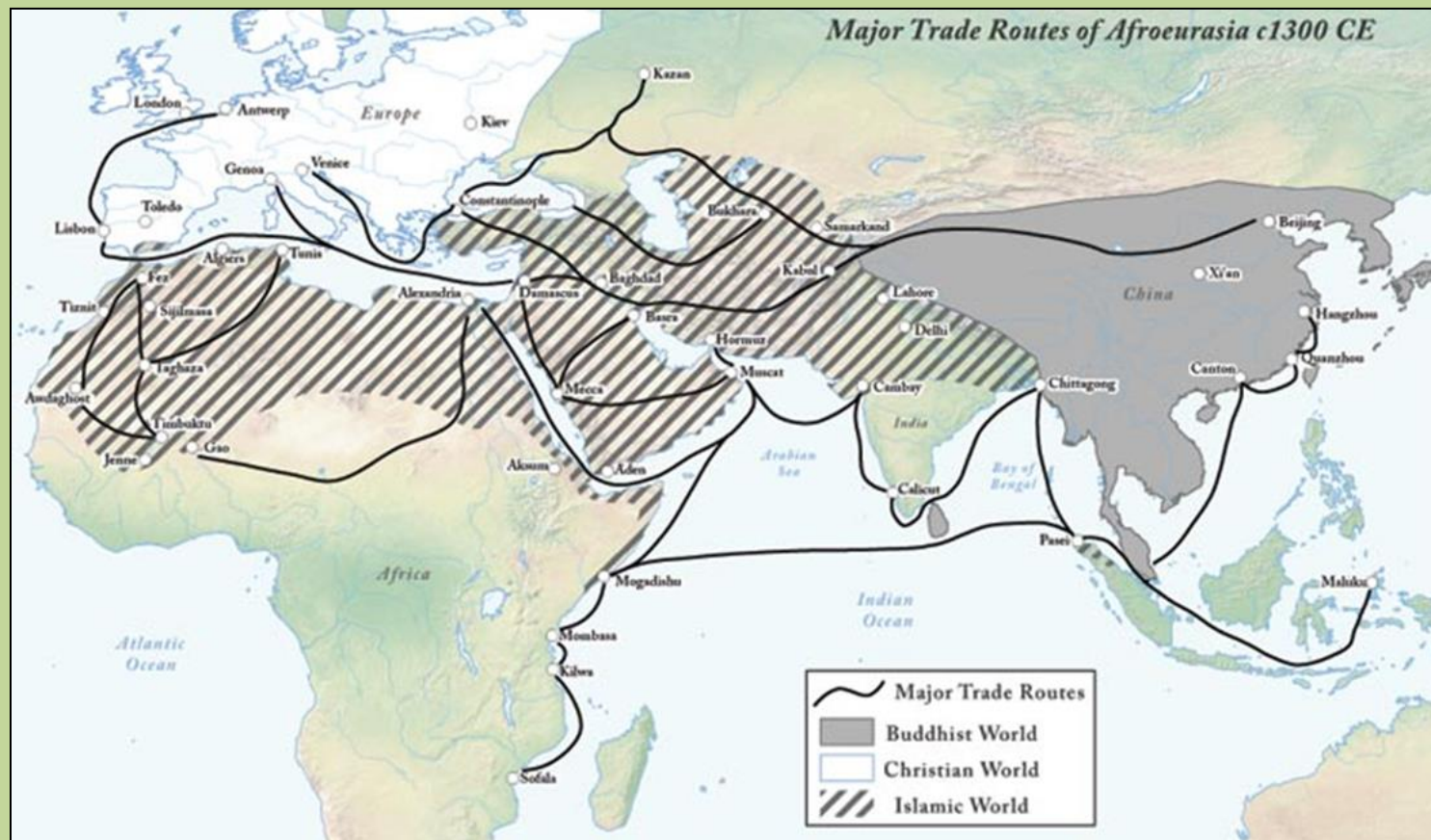

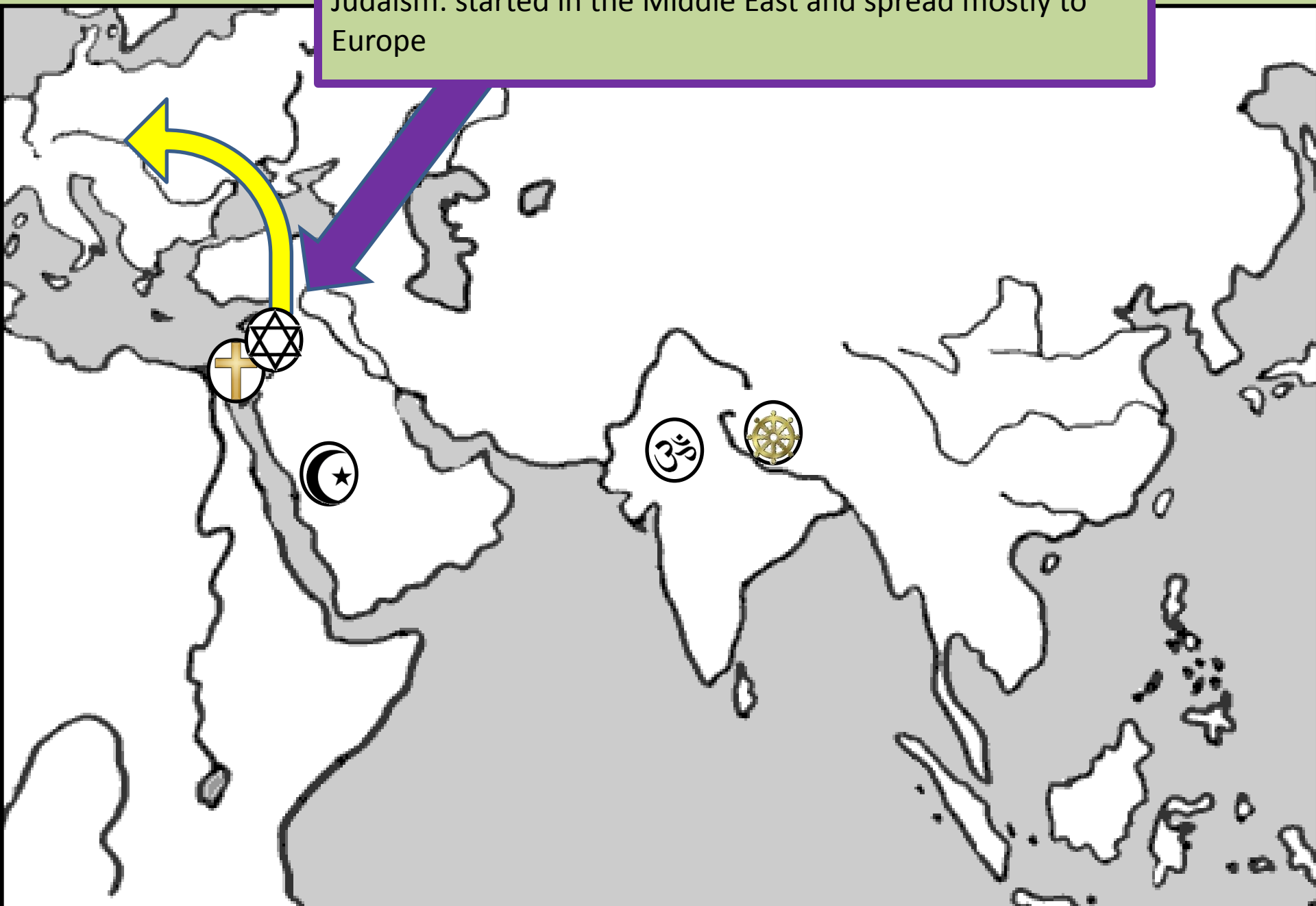

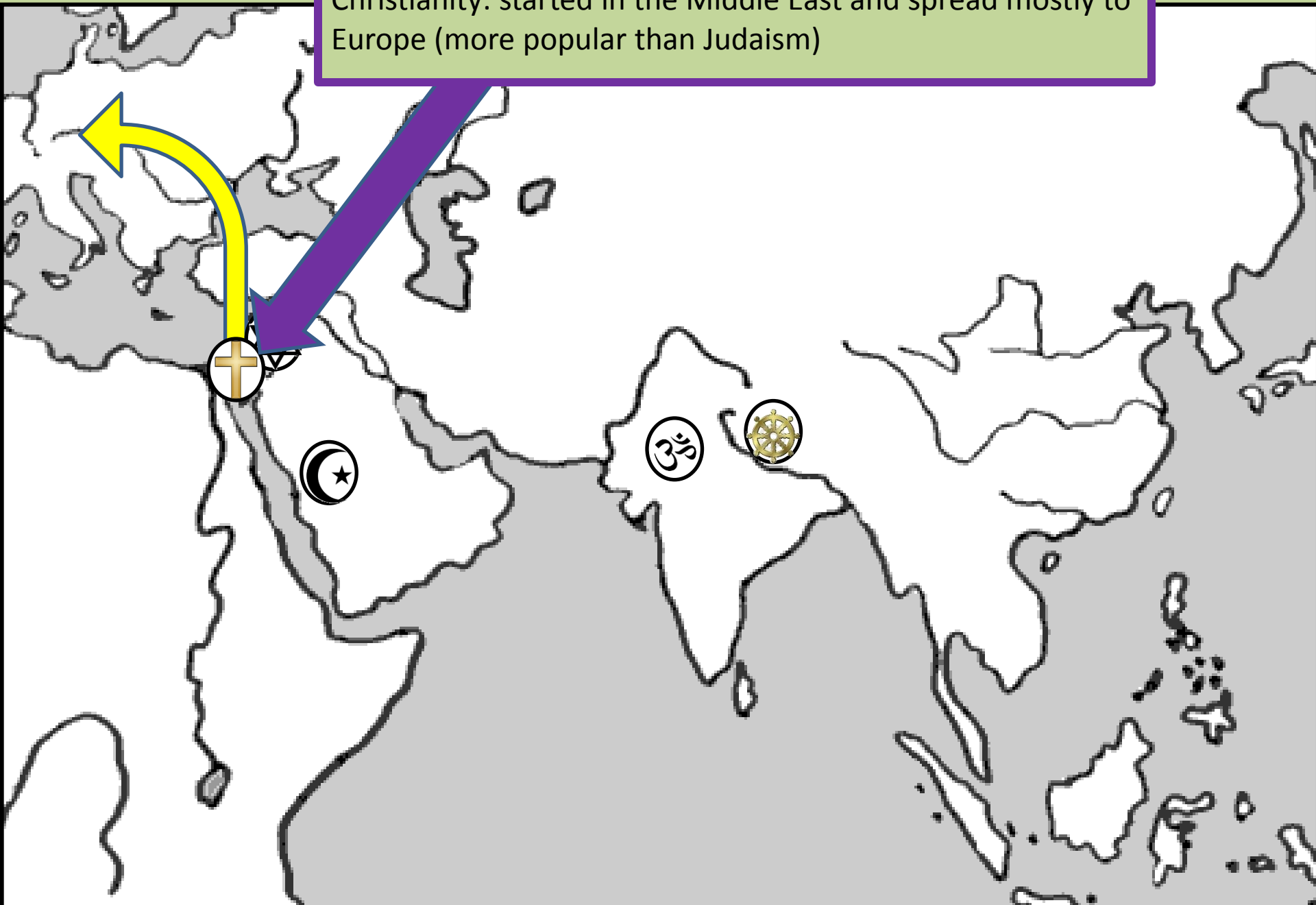

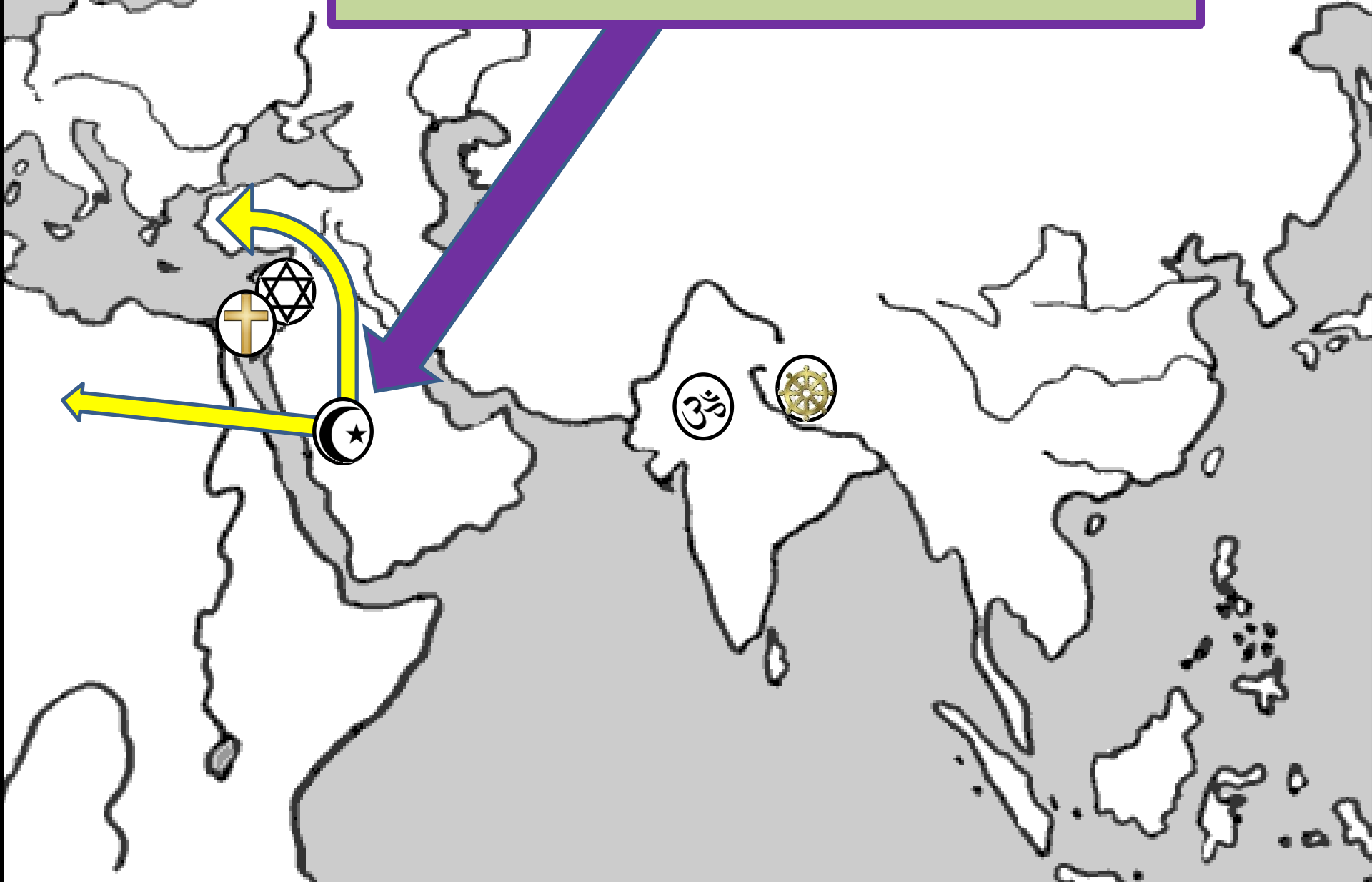
Judaism: started in the Middle East and spread mostly to Europe



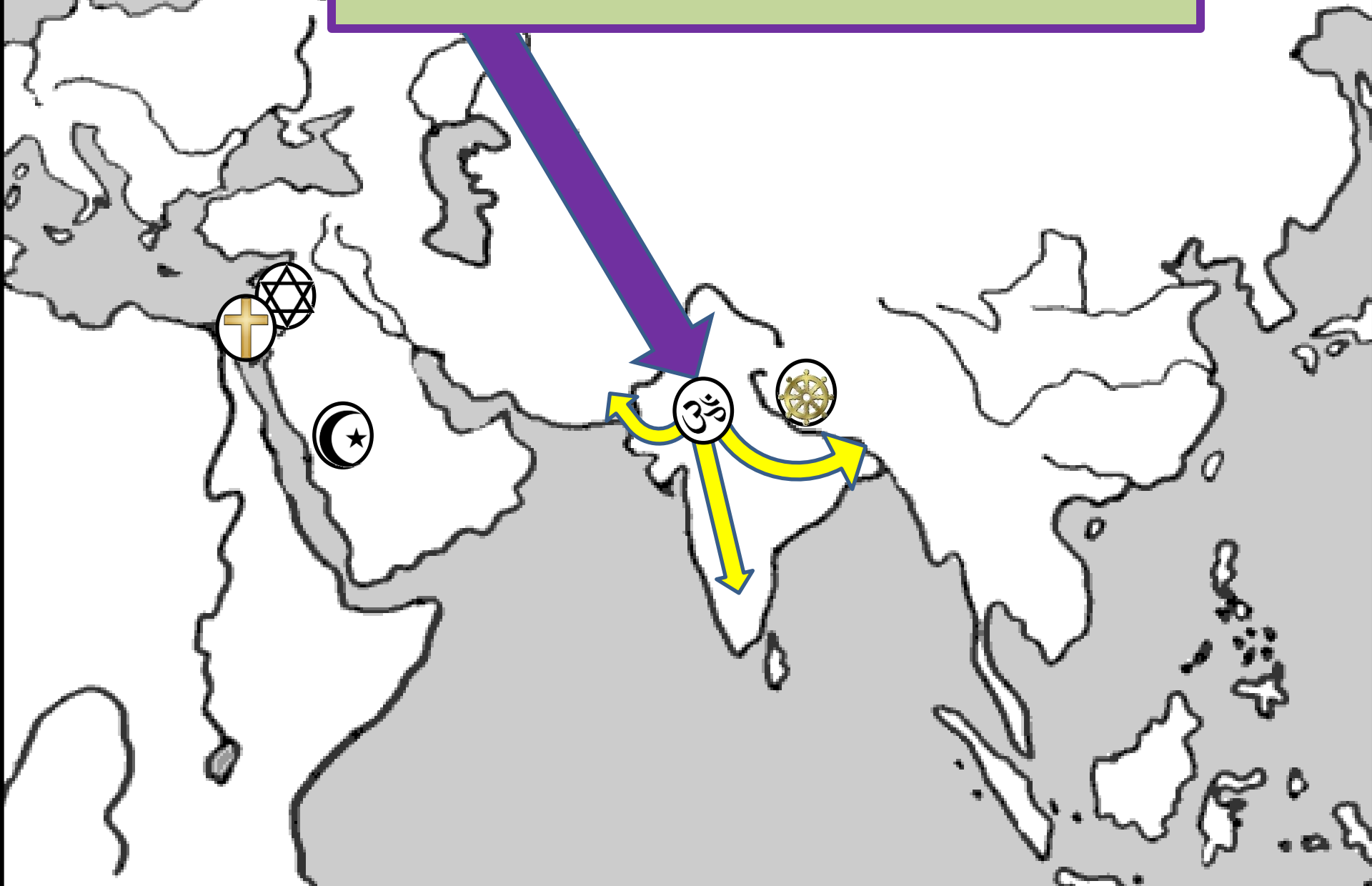
Christianity: started in the Middle East and spread mostly to Europe (more popular than Judaism)



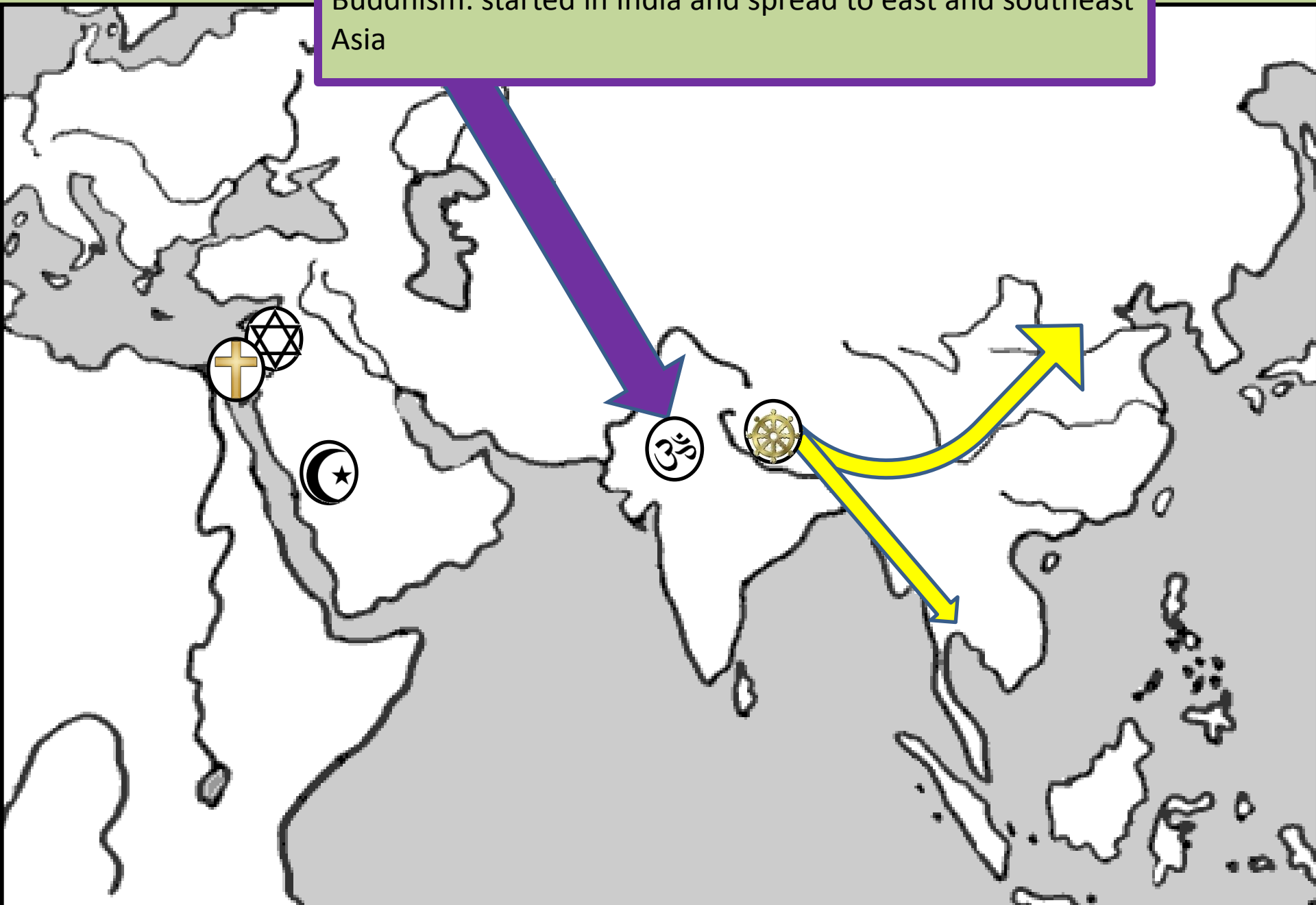
Islam: started in the Middle East and spread mostly to Northern Africa and Southern Europe



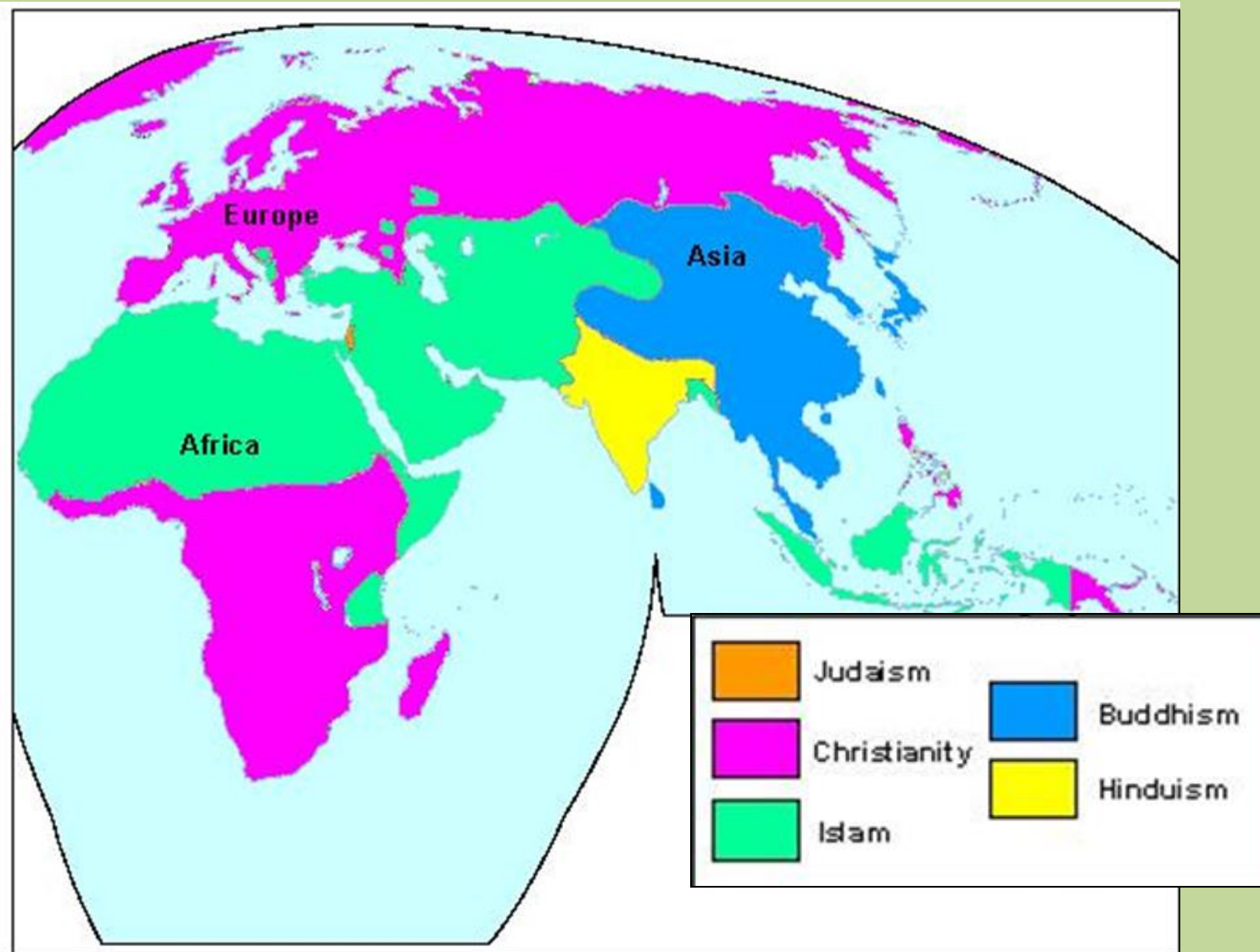
Hinduism: started in India and spread to other most of the Indian “subcontinent”



Buddhism: started in India and spread to east and southeast Asia

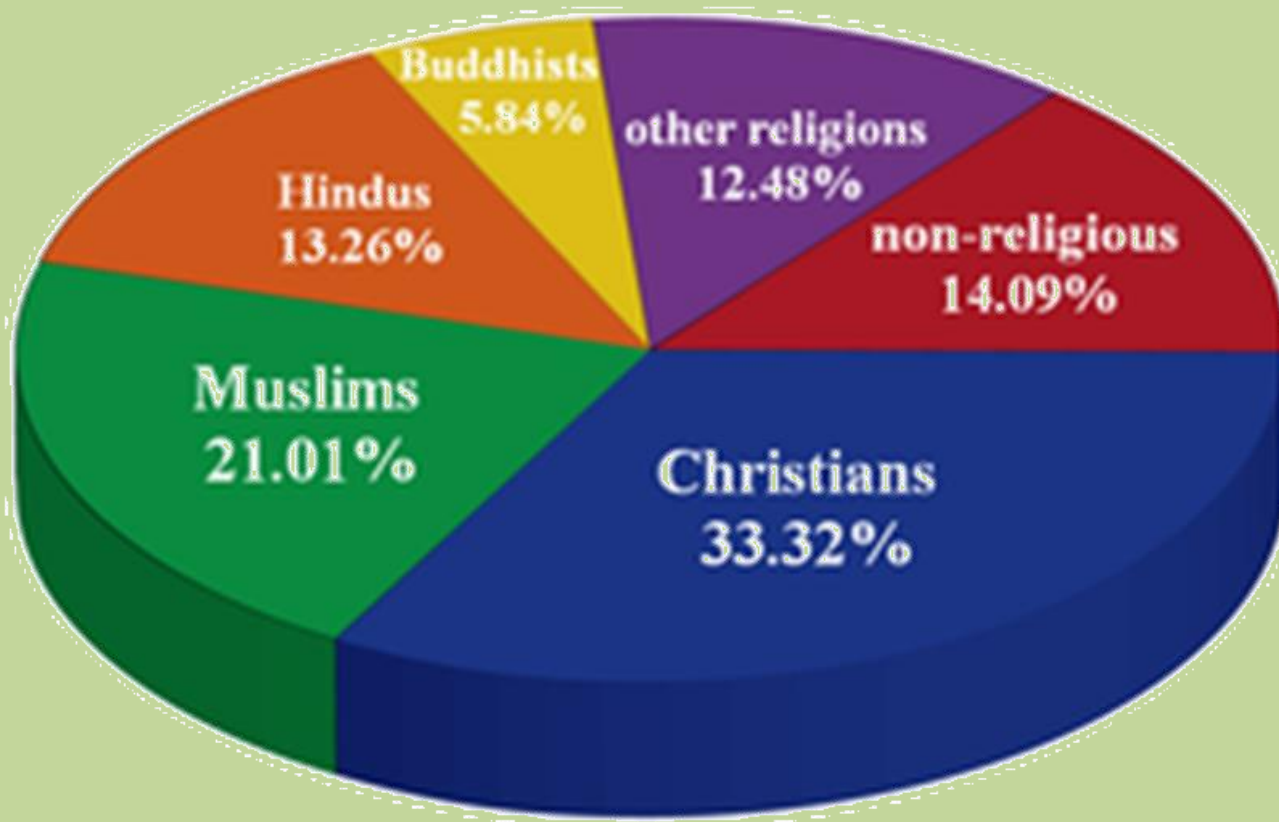


- Now the five major religions spread across Europe, Asia, and Africa like below.

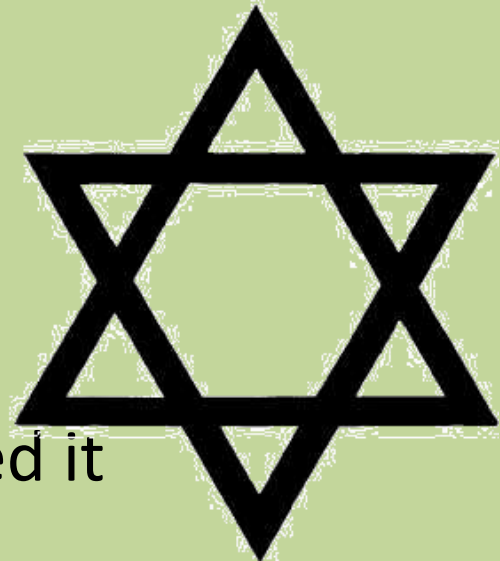

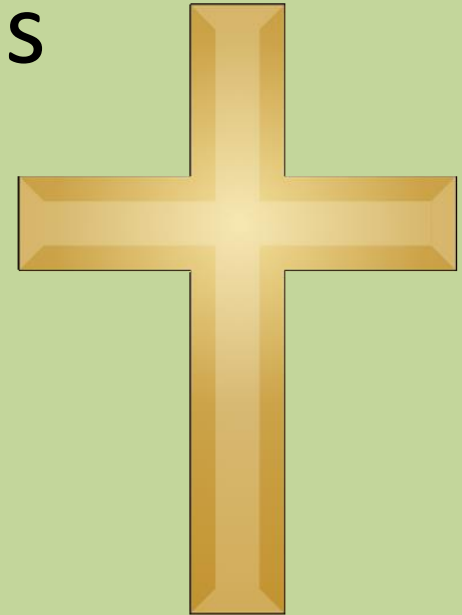

- (*holy book*) Torah: Written records and beliefs of the Jews
- God is known by the names:
 - Yahweh

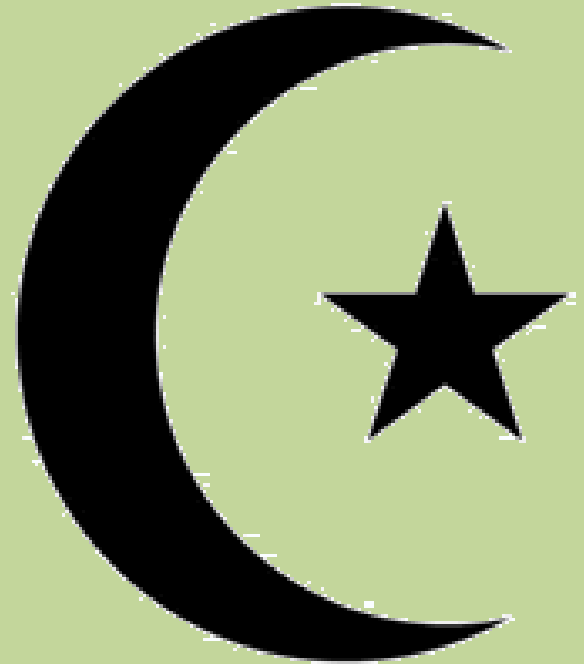

- **Islam**

- Monotheism
- Muhammad, the prophet
- Allah, the God
- Qur'an (Koran) (*holy book*)
- Five Pillars of Islam
- **Mecca** and Medina are holy cities
 - Mecca is the holiest and requires a pilgrimage at least once in your life



Religious beliefs, sacred writings, traditions, and customs

- **Buddhism**

- Founder: Siddhartha Gautama (Buddha)
- Four Noble Truths
- Eightfold Path to Enlightenment
- Spread of Buddhism from India to China and other parts of Asia, resulting from Asoka's missionaries and their writings
- Reincarnation: Rebirth based upon karma
- Karma: Knowledge that all thoughts and actions result in future consequences

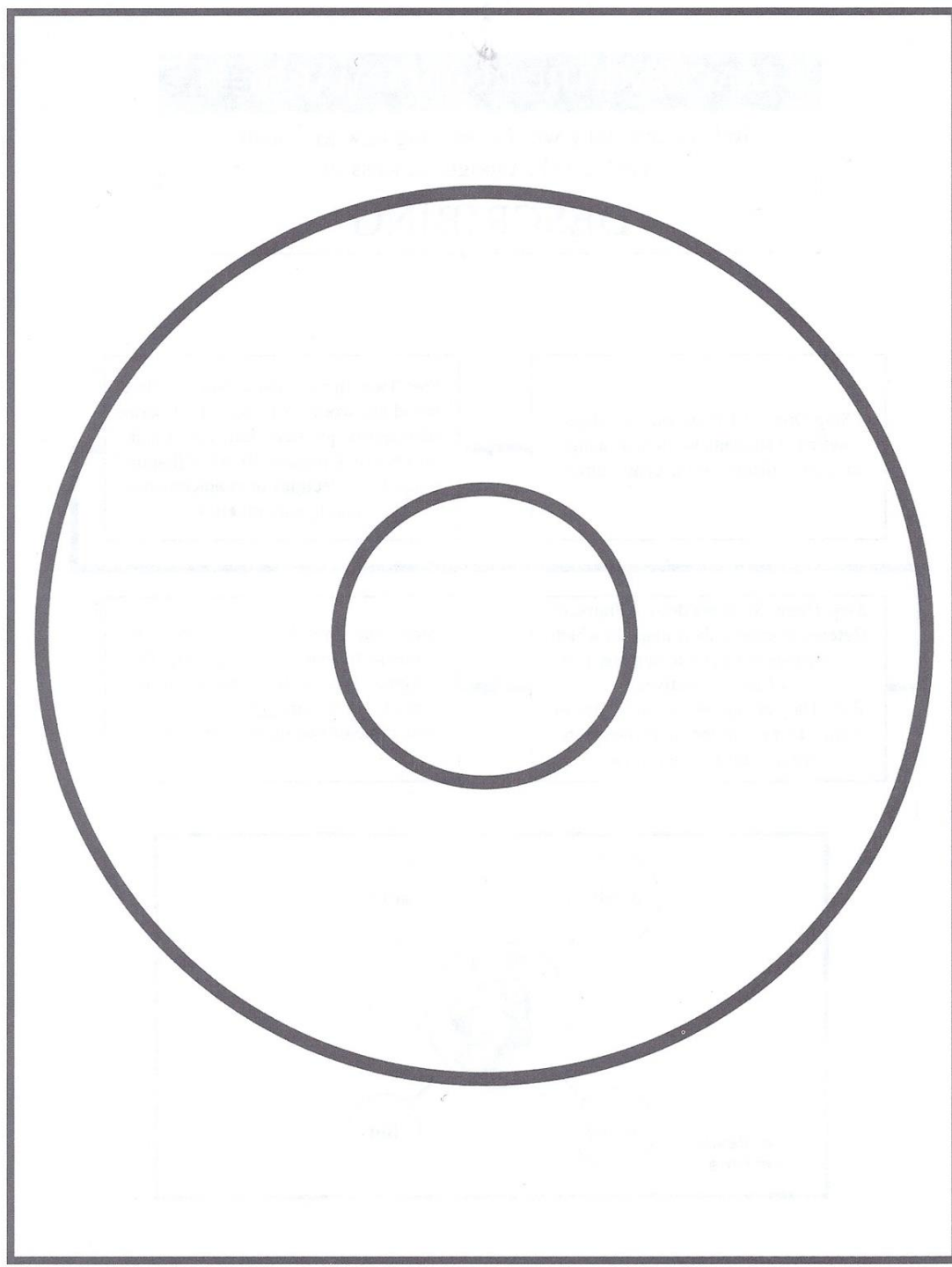

- Reincarnation: Rebirth based upon karma
- Karma: Knowledge that all thoughts and actions result in future consequences
